Preview

I taught as an Associate Professor of the Department of Law, Philosophy and Political Science at the T. H. Shevchenko National University 'Chernihiv Collegium' (Chernihiv, Ukraine).

On February 24, 2022, our city was one of the first in Ukraine to become the object of Russian aggression. Street fights began to take place near our house. Rocket and artillery fire destroyed buildings near us and killed civilians before our eyes. For almost two weeks, my wife, children and grandchildren hid from the shelling in the ill- equipped basement of the house. Eventually, due to the real threat to my family's life, on 6 of March, 2024 we were forced to leave our native city. Firstly, in March 2022, we arrived in Riga and have got the humanitarian visa of the Republic of Latvia. Then, in the spring of 2023, my wife and I moved to Vilnius to reunion with our youngest daughter's family. On March 31, 2023, I received a residence permit in the Republic of Lithuania for the Ukrainian refugees' temporary protection. This temporary residence permit is renewed annually in accordance with EU resolutions.
